Established in 2002 with just five orphaned children, Al Islah Center has since grown into a beacon of hope and transformation. Registered with the government's Social Welfare Board in 2003, our journey has been characterized by resilience, vision, and unwavering commitment. In a mere two years, we transitioned from a rented house to a purpose-built facility, thanks to the generous support of esteemed social and political figures. This dedicated space has not only provided shelter but also nurtured happiness, enthusiasm, and a renewed passion for education and recreation among our children.

Our impact extends beyond our walls. We reached out to orphaned children affected by the devastating 2006 earthquake in Mansehra district. By 2007, these children were not only well-nurtured but were also excelling in education and sports at district and provincial levels.

Our commitment to education is unwavering. In 2009, we established a library with 1,000 books and offered vocational training workshops. In the same year, we extended our reach by establishing a higher secondary school, benefiting both orphans and the wider community. In 2010, we proudly unveiled a fully sophisticated building to accommodate 300 children, witnessing our family grow to a hundred and fifty. In 2015, recognizing the need to empower girls, we opened a branch in Islamabad dedicated to young girls in need. Our dedication to community well-being is evident. In 2022, we built a beautiful mosque, and in 2023, we established a madrasah to cater to local educational needs.

We owe our achievements to the collaboration of philanthropists, politicians, and prominent personalities who have wholeheartedly engaged with our organization. Their support has enabled us to nurture, educate, and uplift 450 orphans, transforming them into productive contributors to society.

Resolution of a Long-Standing Infrastructure Issue

Over the past five years, Al Islah Center has encountered a persistent challenge related to the acquisition of a plot situated between the mosque and the hostel. The plot posed a significant obstacle for the 100 orphaned children, impeding their access to the mosque to offer their daily prayers. Recognizing the critical importance of addressing this issue, the management decided to purchase the plot at a discounted rate of PKR 11 million, with the invaluable assistance of a generous donor who extended financial support. The acquisition of this plot, valued at PKR 21 million, not only resolves a pressing concern but also lays the groundwork for the establishment of a Madrasah for girls, ensuring the provision of quality education and spiritual guidance for future generations.

With immense gratitude, Alhamdulillah, Masjid Al Farooq has been fully operationalized, providing comprehensive services to the local community. The mosque has facilitated the offering of five daily prayers, while also serving as a platform for the teaching and learning of the Holy Quran's translation, Hadiths, Qaida, Nazra, Hifz, and Darse Nizami. Furthermore, the successful initiation of the Juma prayers has garnered significant support and participation from hundreds within the local community. The mosque stands as a testament to the organization's expanding vision and impact, serving as a perpetual source of blessings for our esteemed donors.

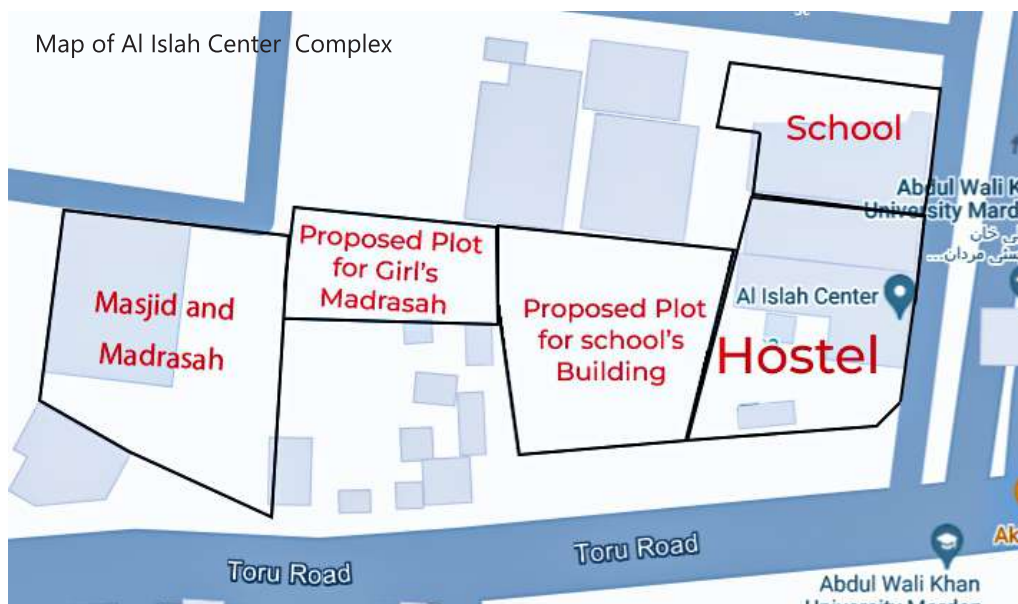
Empowering Girls' Education in Islamabad:
